

## BEGINNER1. LESSON #20. WHAT DO I KNOW

Lesson 20 ! Congratulations, you are already quite advanced in learning French.  
Let's sum up what we know at this point.

- You met the definite articles : *le, la, l'* and *les* and you know now how to use them.

<i>le</i>	<i>la</i>	<i>l'</i>	<i>les</i>
with a masculine noun	with a feminine noun	with a masculine or a feminine noun that begins with a vowel or an unpronounced h	with a plural noun
<i>le garçon, le jouet</i>	<i>la fille, la poupée</i>	<i>l'enfant, l'éléphant</i>	<i>les voitures, les fleurs</i>

- You know some possessive determinants :

	with a masculine and singular noun	with a feminine and singular noun	with a plural noun
My	<i>Mon</i>	<i>Ma</i>	<i>Mes</i>
Your	<i>Ton</i>	<i>Ta</i>	<i>Tes</i>
His / Her / Its	<i>Son</i>	<i>Sa</i>	<i>Ses</i>

- You know how to make negative sentences using *ne... pas* :

Subjet + *ne* (or sometimes **n'**) + verb + *pas* + the end of the sentence

*Je ne veux pas de bonbons.*

*Tu n'aimes pas le poisson.*

*Tu n'habites pas à Paris.*

- You know the entire conjugaison of *avoir* in the present tense :

J'ai	I have
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Tu as	You have
Il a, elle a	He has, she has
Nous avons	We have
Vous avez	You have
Ils ont	They have

- You know the imperative mood of *-er* verbs (only three grammatical persons and no subject pronoun) :


Regarde	Look	Donne	Give
Regardons	Let's look	Donnons	Let's give
Regardez	Look	Donnez	Give

- You know a few colors : *jaune, rouge, noir, blanc et bleu*. Here are the feminine form of these adjectives :

Masculine form	<i>jaune</i>	<i>rouge</i>	<i>noir</i>	<i>blanc</i>	<i>bleu</i>
Feminine form	<i>jaune</i>	<i>rouge</i>	<i>noire</i>	<i>blanche</i>	<i>bleue</i>

- You know some members of the family : *le père (Papa), la mère (Maman), le fils, la fille, les enfants, le grand-père, la grand-mère*.
- And you know an impressive list of *-er* verbs. Most of them are really useful. You can conjugate all of them in the present tense or in the imperative mood.

*Aimer – Entrer – Présenter – Manger – Habiter – Jouer – Manquer – Amener – Donner – Adorer – Regarder – Acheter – Chercher – Garer, se garer.*
